Social Emotional Learning

Before Reading:

- Read the title aloud, along with the author and illustrator. Ask for a prediction on what the book will be about, after showing the cover.
- Do a picture walk by flipping through the pages looking at the illustrations. Let the child make observations. You do not have to read text, unless you want to draw attention to any special features.
- Have you had an enemy? What would you do to get rid of an enemy, if you had one?

During Reading:

- What did Jeremy Ross do to make him an enemy to the little boy?
- How does enemy pie work to get rid of enemies?
- What did the little boy discover when playing with Jeremy Ross?

After Reading:

- What does enemy pie do to your enemies?

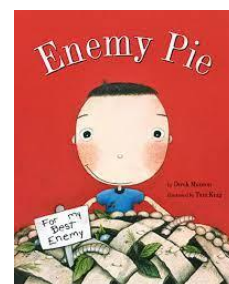
Putting into Practice:

- What emotions might we feel if we have an enemy, or someone that teases or bullies us?
- How did the little boy deal/handle his enemy/bully situation?
- What are things we can do if we have someone that makes fun of us or bullies us?
- What can we do if we see someone being bullied, teased, or make fun of?
